



My Heart Strangely Warmed!

The month of May is an important one for Methodists all over the world. While attending a Moravian small group meeting at Aldersgate Street in London, John Wesley—the founder of the Methodist movement—felt his heart strangely warmed and found himself converted to Christ. This was after being raised in a Christian home, being an ordained pastor in the Church of England, starting the Methodist Movement, and having been a missionary to the colony of Georgia. He wrote in his journal that evening 284 years ago,


In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.

Let me offer three reflections inspiring from Wesley's journal entry:

God works in our hearts: Our hearts are the field for divine mission and work. God is always reaching out to touch our hearts, to convert us to loving relationship with him if we are open to receiving him. Methodists believe that only such a heart-warming conversion to a life of love and holiness can lead to the transformation of the world into the loving and holy community God intends for it to be. This conversion (teshuva in Hebrew and *metanoia* in Greek) means being moved by God's grace to make a U-turn toward God and the path of righteousness. While John Wesley experienced this transformation by the power of the Holy Spirit, this conversion can be either a dramatic experience or a process; what is important is that this transformation take place in our lives.

It is all the work of Christ: John Wesley was very much a Christ-centered person. He acknowledges that everything in the Christian life is the work of Jesus Christ our Lord. He trusted in Christ and in Christ alone for his salvation. It is the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ that brings us to salvation. We simply trust in him. As the apostle Paul wrote, "For it is by grace you have

been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast," (Ephesians 2:8-9).



The fire of divine love changes the world: After May 24, 1738, the world was never the same! Wesley went on preach in the open air and streets, he reached out to the poor and marginalized in the society, he organized spiritual and moral support meetings for coal miners, he travelled on horseback as far as Ireland to share the Gospel, he started the first-ever Methodist school at Kingswood in Barth, and he organized Class Meetings and other small groups where all Methodists publicly reflected on the question: How it is with your Soul? Out of the British Methodist movement Thomas Coke, Francis Asbury, and their compatriots in ministry began overseas mission work to India, Sri Lanka, and the New World. All of what commenced at Aldersgate came to be a magnificent work of world mission, and it is now a world church today. We United Methodists have our share in that great cloud of witnesses and in the ongoing mission and ministry of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church, the Body of Christ.

This year 2022, we celebrate the 284th anniversary of John Wesley's conversion at Aldersgate. Not for his sake, but because it is a model for us, showing how we are to open our hearts so that God, the Holy Spirit, can warm our hearts today. Like he did with Wesley, he can bring us to true and lasting conversion in Christ—and through that into the life of personal and social holiness.

Praise God for life and witness of his servant John Wesley. Happy Methodist May!

Wisconsin Annual Conference In- Gathering

We are preparing Personal Dignity Kits to be delivered to the WI Annual Conference on June 10 in Green Bay. These kits will be given out to families and individuals who are displaced from their homes by fire, flood, storms, and other natural and man-made disasters across the United States.

The kits consist of the following:

- 1 bath hand towel (no kitchen towels)
- 1 bath washcloth (no dishcloths)
- 1 adult toothbrush (no multipacks)
- 1 bar of soap (3-4 ounces)
- 1 bottle of shampoo (15-18 ounces)
- 1 deodorant (2-30 ounce sticks, roll-on, or pump)

All items must be new and placed in a 1-gallon resealable plastic bag.

In addition, there is a \$2 donation for razor and toothpaste. (Please do NOT include a razor or toothpaste in the bag).

Please bring your donations to the church by June 5. There is a bin in Fellowship Hall labeled *In-Gathering WAC 2022*.

If you would like to donate without shopping, please write a check in the amount of \$15 to WI Conference with "Ingathering Home Care Kit" in the memo line.


HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Did you know that ECUMC has a long history of supporting and working with Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity? After our pause during the pandemic, we will again offer our help to Habitat. There will be opportunities to give our financial support and to learn more about what Habitat of Humanity does in Milwaukee. There will also be chances to work with Habitat to build homes! Habitat for Humanity is beginning the "Build On Faith House" sponsored by the Church Coalition (which includes ECUMC!) on June 4. Keep an eye out for more information in upcoming eNews and bulletins!

Church Council has given permission for funds for the Scrip Account to be used for our Mission Team's work. Currently there is approximately \$2,800. After a deduction \$1,000, which is the cushion needed to order Scrip), the remaining \$1,800 could be used for Summerfield's Food Program, the Honduras program, Northcott Neighborhood House, or other programs we support. The Mission Committee will continue to meet and decide how to best use those funds. One of the first donations will be to Habitat for Humanity.

Please support the Scrip Program so that our church can continue to give to these worthy and important ministries!

Ephesians 3:20: "Now to God who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to God's power that is at work within us."




My son always enjoyed fishing as a child. You can imagine the excitement of a 5-year-old with a fishing rod! Besides fishing, he always had fun throwing rocks into the lake. He enjoyed seeing how far they could go and the ripples they created. That was a great teaching moment.

Do you know your words and actions are like these rocks? You do one thing, but it has a reaction much larger.

There is a church in our conference that received an estate gift in the mid 1990's for youth. The gift was \$5,000 and was invested at the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. That gift has grown. In the last 25 years, over \$6,500 has been used for youth ministry! There is still almost \$7,000 in that fund today! Isn't it wonderful how one gift can affect youth for years?

Isn't it wonderful that one gift is a much larger action than the original giver could have ever known? How are you giving to the church with your time, talents, and treasures? What ripple effect will it have now and in the future?
