From September 4th to October 2nd Emmanuel Community Church will again celebrate the Season of Creation. As we enter early fall we take special notice of the beautiful creation God has given us and our need to care for it, which will be emphasized by our worship messages and activities during these weeks.

The theme of this year's Season of Creation is "Listen to the Voice of Creation." God's creation speaks to us constantly through beautiful plants and scenery. But it also speaks through wildfires, storms, and drought to let us know that the creation is being damaged. Those who are affected by these natural calamities speak to us through their pain and loss. Are we listening? Are we trying to heal the injuries to God's creation? We will use the symbol of the burning bush that spoke to Moses in the book of Exodus as a symbol of how God speaks to us through nature.

Two special events will help us celebrate this season. In the afternoon of September 18th we'll visit Lannon Sunflower Farm, which is only about three miles from our church. This farm has beautiful fields of sunflowers and a special area of wildflowers that provide food for butterflies and other wildlife.

We'll walk trails at the farm and participants can pick sunflowers to decorate their homes with these beautiful flowers that birds love. Cost is about \$5 per person. Time will be in the weekly Emmanuel eNews.



On October 2nd we'll have a bee expert speak to us at worship about how bees can teach us lessons about living in community. After worship he'll lead an Intergenerational Sunday School program which will help us understand the importance of bees in the environment. His passion for these members of God's creation is powerful!

Friends, we are now in September! Time flew so fast this summer! Now the Autumn season is just around the corner.

My family and I are so grateful to all of you at Emmanuel Community for allowing us to go to Sri Lanka to see our family in July. We were there for sixteen days, our travel was smooth, and we were overwhelmed by the radical hospitality of our family and friends. We were able to make some visits to Kandy, South of Colombo, and Negombo despite some transportation difficulties. All these are truly beautiful heavenly places on earth. Did you know that Sri Lanka has another name? "Paradise!" Truly it is! We thank Karen Burzinski, our director for Children Ministries, for sharing our photos on Facebook and in doing so, helped us all to stay connected.

As wonderful as our trip was as a whole, Sri Lanka is a nation that was and still is in deep crisis. An economic crisis has now turned into a political crisis. It began in April of this year when the young people in Sri Lanka (called Strugglers) began protesting for their fundamental rights and for social and political reforms. These young people were joined by great multitudes supporting their call. We are very thankful for your prayers and intercessions. My family's and my prayers throughout these protests have come from the Prophet Amos, who said, "But let justice roll down like water and righteousness like an everflowing stream," (Amos 5:24, NRSV-UE).

Sri Lanka has had a strong democratic tradition for the last seventy-five years, and we hope the country will be able to resolve any issues within a democratic framework; a framework that honors the demands and reforms called by the new generation. While we were there, we were able to witness both the woundedness and healing of this world. In doing so, we are hope-filled.

These sorts of issues, though, are not only issues in Sri Lanka. They are also very much the reality of our world. My

family and I have seen and shared in this woundedness and brokenness here in the United States throughout our service here as missionaries. We – the whole human race – have a long way to go. Yes, we are wounded – but we are called to be wounded healers like Christ. You can share your woundedness with friends in mutual support and understanding. Christ is there to heal all of us.

I am grateful for our staff who took such great care of Emmanuel Community during our time in Sri Lanka. While physically away from Emmanuel, you all were in our thoughts and prayers all the time.


Speaking of prayer, I urge all of us to pray for the Season of Creation (September 4th through October 2nd), as well as for our preparation for Fall and Advent.


What do we at Emmanuel Community United Methodist Church believe? How do we live our lives as Methodist Christians? Who are the people called Methodists?

Creation Justice Tips from The Green Team

The United Methodist Creation Justice Movement provides "Tips" each month as a tool to equip church members, families, and individuals to respond to God's call to care for creation and do justice with our neighbors. Below, you will find some selected tips to consider adopting or practicing. Check to see what might fit your life.

Conserve: When you realize something wonderful is being chipped away, take action to stop the damage. Visit the Nature Conservancy website.

Regenerate: When you despair over degradation, remember "The earth is the LORD's" (Psalm 24:1) and dig in with hope. Work in harmony with God's natural systems to bring back life. Composting, clearing waterways, planting for pollinators are ways.

Renew: Immerse yourself in nature. Try forest bathing, hiking, enjoying a park, hunting for waterfalls and wildflowers, going to a botanical garden or arboretum, getting out on the water in a sailboat, kayak, or canoe.

Invest: What you choose to use your money for makes a difference. Even small "investments," such as purchases of

organic food and items that are not plastic count, as well as any other outlay of your money, time, or effort that contributes to a healthier planet.

Divest: Get rid of "stuff." Shed the burden of the consumerism mentality. Pull out of investments in fossil fuels. Choose simplicity and what's good for the planet.

Teach: Children observe continuously. Teaching younger generations through words, expectations, and especially by example to care for God's creation and to seek justice is a special legacy. "Train children in the right way, and when old, they will not stray" (Proverbs 22:6).

Fall Sunday School – Something for Everyone

Faith development is a life-long endeavor. Taste and See what ECUMC offers in the way of Sunday school classes for children, youth, and adults.

Nursery: Ages 0-2, staffed by caring professionals; open from 8:15-10:45 a.m. and during special events. The Nursery is located across from Fellowship Hall in Room 108. Parents are welcome to stay in the nursery as their children adjust to the new environment. A buzzer system is available to allow caregivers to reach parents as needed.

Jesus' PLACE Preschool: Ages 3-4 and 5 year-old children who have not yet entered kindergarten. Children meet in a dedicated classroom with the same teachers for the entire school year. Parents are welcome to assist. Gather in Room 106 at 8:30 a.m. for Bible stories and stimulating activities designed to introduce children to the love of Jesus. Children will be taken to the Children's Music Room behind Fellowship Hall for Music Time from 9:15-9:30.

Children's Sunday School: Kindergarten through 5th grade. Grade level classes are held from 8:30-9:30 a.m. with the last 15 minutes devoted to Music Time in the Children's Music Room. Please read more about this activity-based Sunday school program in the "Parent/Teacher Orientation" article.

Junior and Senior High Sunday School: 6th-12th grade students meet from 8:30-9:30 a.m. in Room 102, the Youth Room. Hands-on activities, games, and movie clips cement concepts explored in Bible study and discussion portions of each class. Class is held in a relaxed, comfortable classroom. Students are also encouraged to participate in worship services and to assist with preschool and elementary Sunday School classes.



Adult Sunday School: 8:30 a.m. on 2nd-5th Sundays. Adult classes are offered at various times throughout the year and are often based on a 4-6 week topical approach. Watch Pathways, Community News, Monday eNews, and bulletin boards for upcoming opportunities. Be sure to round out your faith development practice by participating in Intergenerational Sunday School following Worship on first Sundays.

Intergenerational Sunday School: 9:45-10:45 a.m. on the 1st Sunday of every month. Intergenerational Sunday School is a community building time of faith and fellowship between all age groups. Sunday School classes for children through adults are suspended on 1st Sundays to allow everyone to worship together in the Sanctuary then grow in faith together in the relaxed atmosphere of Celebration Hall. Coffee and snacks will be served.

Parent/Teacher Orientation Children's Sunday School

The Children's Ministries Team is ready to dive into fall with classrooms full of children in our engaging Workshop Rotation Model Sunday School (WoRM). This very successful Sunday School model we have used at ECUMC for kindergarten through 5th grade, is more than worksheets and assigned classrooms. Children focus on one Bible story a month, experiencing the story from a variety of angles in a different classroom each week. Weekly repetition cements this newfound knowledge for children. Children who cannot attend every week still grasp the concepts and never feel like they are missing out, because projects do not carry over from one week to the next.

Parents and Guardians, we want to help you learn the system, understand why we teach the way we do, and take the confusion out of finding your child's classroom on Sunday mornings.

This model requires a teacher and assistant in each classroom weekly. There are opportunities for adults and high school students who would like to serve all year, and there are short-term opportunities for anyone interested in a 3-4 week position.

We invite all who desire to help our children grow in their relationship with Christ to come to Sunday School September 18th at 8:30 a.m. Choose the age group with which you would like to participate, and experience WoRM Sunday School with the children. During music time at the end of class, adults will have the opportunity to ask questions and learn how they can serve our children.
