A WORD FROM PASTOR MATT

Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it. Hebrews 13:2

One definition of hospitality reads; “the friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers.” In the book of Genesis, Abraham encountered three strangers outside his home. He eagerly extended hospitality to them. What he didn’t know at the time was these were not just “strangers” whom he had never met before. They were in fact from God! His hospitality turned into a blessing for him and his wife Sarah.

One of the things I have heard in my Meet & Greet sessions is a sense of delight that there are so many new faces joining us in worship on Sundays this summer. Everyone here at Emmanuel wants the church to grow as we make disciples and expand the impact we can have here in Menomonee Falls and beyond.

Have you ever stopped and wondered what they may be experiencing when they walk through our doors? Do you remember the first time you walked through our doors for the first time? What was your experience? Who made you feel welcome, and how did they do it?

One of our frequent guests this summer is a retired UMC pastor named John Sumwalt. He faithfully served local churches in Wisconsin from 1972 until his retirement. As a retired pastor he has had the opportunity to visit many churches. He knows what it is like to be welcomed well, chased away, and maybe even scared to death. He recently wrote an article that was picked up for publication entitled “How to Welcome Visitors to Your Church.”

His short article begins:

When I visit your church for the first time, consider the possibility that I might be looking for a church home. I’m a good-looking old guy with gray hair. But I dress down in the summer, so don’t be put off by my cargo shorts and tank top. Talk to me!

Leave your circle of friends who are gabbing about the price of gas at Kwik Trip and say hello before I sneak out the door. Smile as you

approach with outstretched hand. Introduce yourself.

After a few pleasantries, ask, “What brought you here today?”

Listen closely, on a heart level; I may not tell you the real reason. After all I will be suspicious that you are just another overeager doorkeeper type hoping to find new blood to serve on some committee.

Do not ask, “Are you new here? Keep smiling; I might tell you why I really came. It might be something like, “I just moved here, and I am looking around for a church.”

Resist the urge to move in closer like a used-car salesman to close the deal, with your hand on my shoulder. Keep listening. I might say something like, “I am going to have surgery next week, and I just wanted to be in church today.” Keep listening. Let me talk.”

Come for the whole morning or drop in as your schedule permits. (It's fine to just come for lunch!)

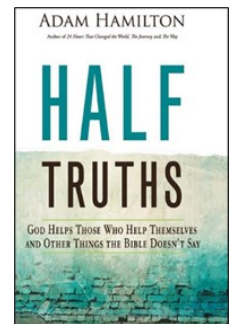
Book Study: Wednesday evenings, 7-00-8:30 PM

What gives Christians the right to disregard any of Jesus' teachings?

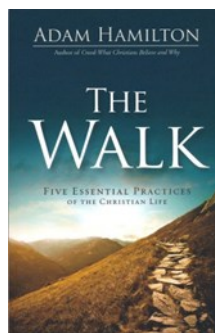
Intrigued? Come and grow your faith with other thoughtful Christians, as we discuss, debate, and deliberate current events and our discipleship. Come every week or as often as you can!

Join Adam Hamilton in this 5-week Bible study to search for the whole truth by comparing common Christian clichés with the wisdom found in Scripture.

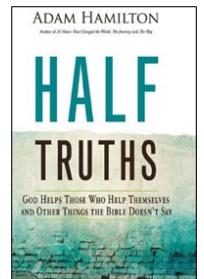

STEWARDSHIP: IS GIVING HARD?

How many times have you been asked to donate to a cause? When the amount is left to you...most find it pretty easy to open the wallet, scan a QR code, log into an app or write a check to make a donation. Right?

How many times have you been asked to share a talent, e.g. creatively read a book to your child's class, present a bible lesson at church, or support a group in your community to teach them how to play a new game?

Each of us has talents to share, right?

How often have you been asked to volunteer your time? Some examples might be to teach a weekly Sunday School Class, coach your child's t-ball team, organize an event or maybe take someone for a medical treatment, etc.

We have the time, right?

When we think of Stewardship, we think of the 3 T's. and routinely recite them in this order: "Time, Talents and Treasures". Why is "Time" listed first? God knows "Time" is the most important. "Time" is mentioned over 600 times in the bible. In Psalm 90:12, "So teach *us* to number our days, that we may apply *our* hearts unto wisdom.". We learn in this verse that our days are limited and to make the most of them. To do this, we need to learn about God and what he has planned for us to share. In Ephesians 5:15-17 we read "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fool, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord *is*."

To be a good Steward for God, our church and our community, we need to be purposeful with our "Time". It's a limitation we all have to deal with. When you hear about Stewardship, realize that it not just about contributions/money, but about sharing of your talents and your time.



God has given each of us time, talents and treasures to share. He has promised us that he will multiply what we do with these gifts. Because of that, you will find that giving is not hard when you are sharing the gifts God has provided. He has prepared these specifically for you, let's use them.

REPORT FROM WI ANNUAL CONFERENCE UMC

June 9-11 2023, Green Bay, WI

Bonnie Falk, Lay Delegate for ECUMC

Being the Lay Delegate to Annual Conference from Emmanuel Community was indeed an experience and challenge, because of this time of transition for the Denomination and my own inexperience as a delegate.



Being a UM clergy spouse for many decades I've been there often, but not in an official capacity, so when Pastor Jerome approached me in Spring it was only through God's grace and received courage I accepted.

This 2023 Annual Conference was truly historical, as were UM annual conferences all across the country and world, as the primary focus was to approve those churches choosing to leave the UMC denomination. Bishop Hee-Soo Jung, the Cabinet and leaders of the WI conference created an atmosphere of respect, acceptance, renewal and a vision for the future. The Holy Spirit was obvious through the venue's of Worship, Bible Study, Music, Drama and small group interactions around each table.

There were a total of 933 registered with 23% being online. This represents clergy, and one or two delegates from each of the 442 churches in the WI Conference.

The first order of business and major vote of the conference the first day, Friday, was that of accepting the requests of the 43 local churches in the Conference (10%) to disaffiliate, be removed, from the United Methodist Denomination. One major issue for leaving was disagreement on the ordination of LGBTQ persons, and their right to perform weddings of same sex couples.

These churches had met the seventeen guidelines created by the 2019 General Conference, and they qualified for a disaffiliate vote of the assembled delegates. The vote to “release” and allow the request was passed by 93.5% majority. (461 yes, 32 no, 0 abstain) As of June 30, 2023 these churches are no longer considered United Methodist.

All voting was done electronically and timed, with each delegate having two devices. Pre-conference zoom meetings were required for delegates to learn the protocols.

There were many emotions felt during these past few years and at Conference. My own included, as I watched churches from my hometown, sister-in-law’s church, and a church my clergy husband served faithfully for many years disaffiliate. One of these churches was considered “home” by our three children and two foreign exchange students.
